Observing outdoor play with a rain stick



Video: Rain stick in the yard

OBJECTIVES

- Promoting children's holistic development.
- Observing the development and behaviour of children.
- Organizing the educational environment.
- Integrating the language and culture of belonging into educational practices.

ACTIVITY DETAILS

Approximate duration: 2 hrs



STEP 1

1.1 Watch the video clip as a group or individually.

STEP 2

2.1 In teams of two or three, determine how the layout of the outdoor educational environment relates to the culture of belonging.

STEP 3

- **3.1** Read the following short text on the rain stick:
 - In the video, when the children tilt the rain stick, we hear a crackling sound that resembles rain. The rain stick is a traditional percussion instrument. It can also be used as a talking stick to regulate speech in a group. It fascinates children with its unique sound and can also serve as an introduction to music for infants.
- **3.2** Research the origin and role of the rain stick.
- **3.3** Discuss the personal meaning of the rain stick. Compare the different meanings of this instrument from one community or people to another.

STEP 4

- **4.1** As a group or individually, watch the clip again and answer the following probing questions:
 - How is the rain stick needed in the outdoor layout of the yard?
 - How can the rain stick be repurposed inside?
- **4.2** In teams of two or three, answer the following question:
 - How does the transmission of the culture of belonging influence different spheres of development?

STEP 5

- **5.1** To conclude the activity as a group, ask the following additional questions:
 - What is your takeaway from this activity?
 - What did you find surprising in this clip?
 - What do you think of the layout of this part of the outdoor yard?
